

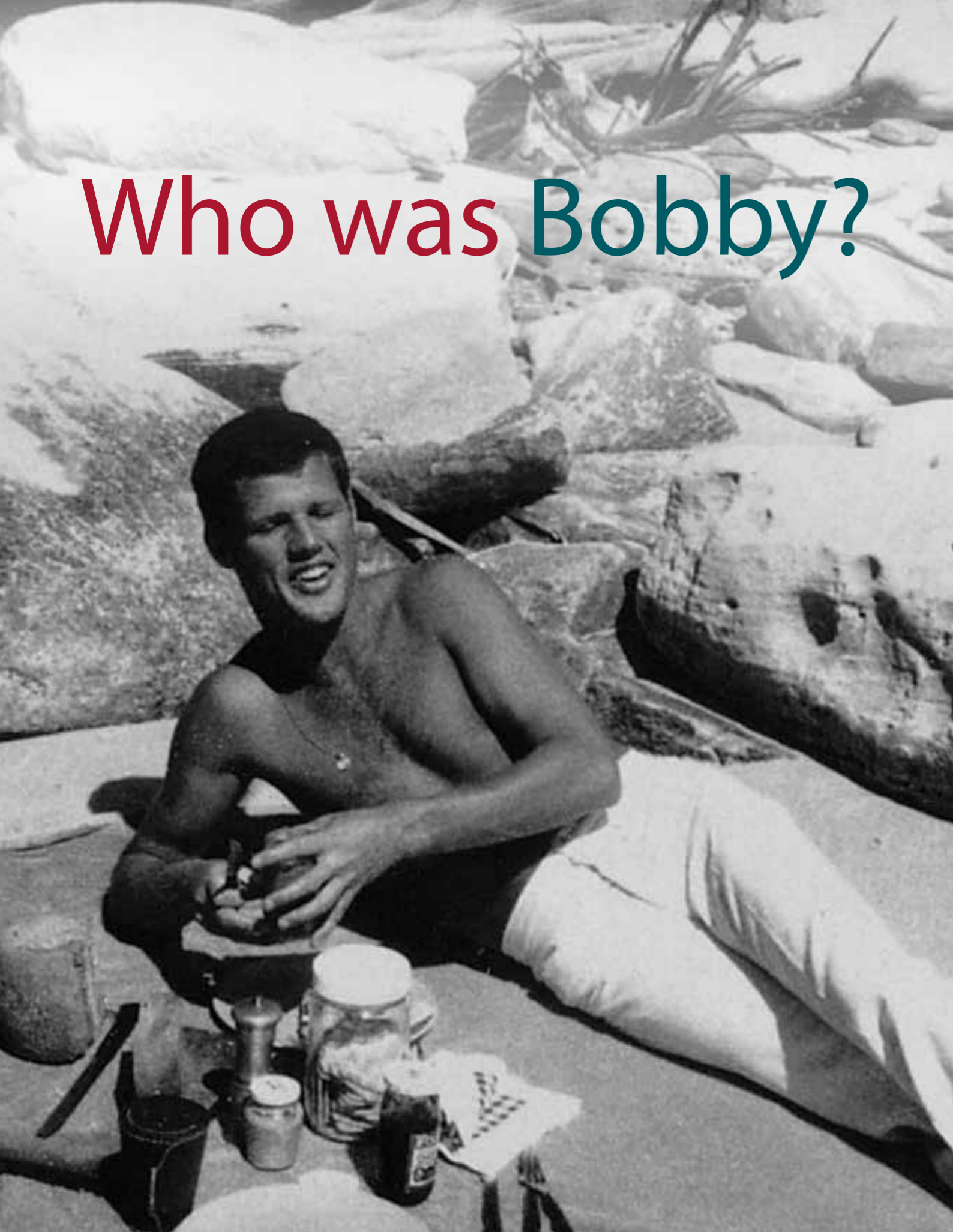

Who was Bobby?



Bobby Goldsmith was one of the first Australians to die from an AIDS-related illness.

That was in June 1984, when Bobby was just 38 years old.

Bobby died with dignity, at home, where he wanted to be, all thanks to the help of his friends who rallied together money and equipment to make his final weeks as comfortable as possible.

Bobby Goldsmith Foundation is the legacy of that dedicated group of friends – a legacy born out of love, which has continued for over 30 years, and will continue, with your help, until everyone living with HIV has the support they need.



What we do

Since 1984 we have been providing practical, emotional, and financial support to people living with HIV in NSW and SA.

Thanks to some effective HIV medications, most people living with HIV are living longer and healthier lives.

HIV is changing however, and many different communities of people living with HIV still need our support.

Every week, more people from diverse backgrounds including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, new migrants to Australia and an increasing heterosexual community are seeking our support.

Bequests are a vital source of our income and each year they help fund our core services and health and wellbeing programs.





How we do it



Our dedicated Case Managers provide advocacy support in dealing with issues around housing, legal and mental health services, helping our clients navigate the increasing challenges in their lives.



Our Financial Counsellors work to alleviate the stress of our clients' financial worries, immeasurably improving their quality of life and helping them plan for a future they may not have anticipated.



Our Community Support Services help our clients live independently through assistance in daily activities such as shopping for groceries and attending medical appointments.

We help empower people to live self-sufficiently, while ensuring they stay connected to their community.

(To leave a fixed portion of your total estate)

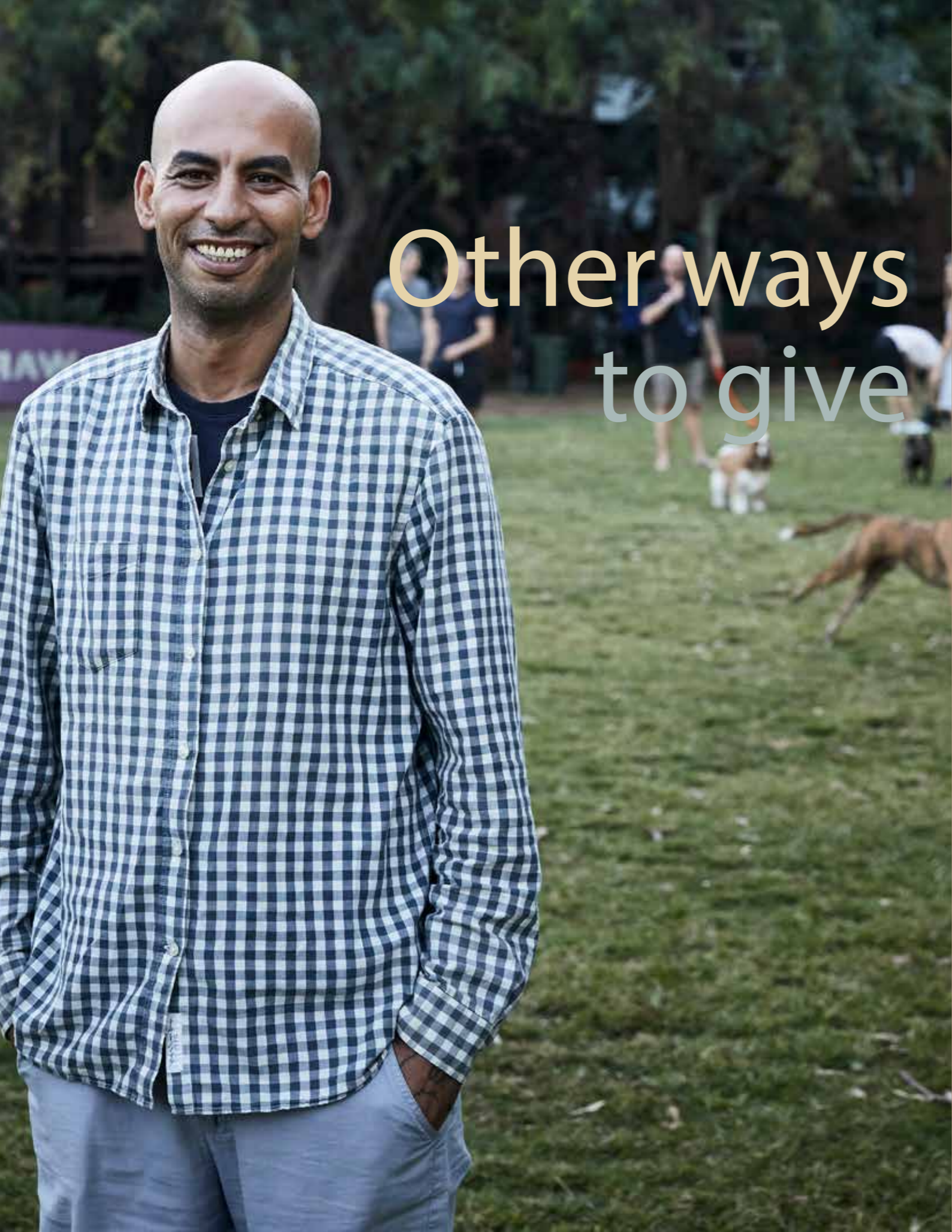


- specific gift ...
